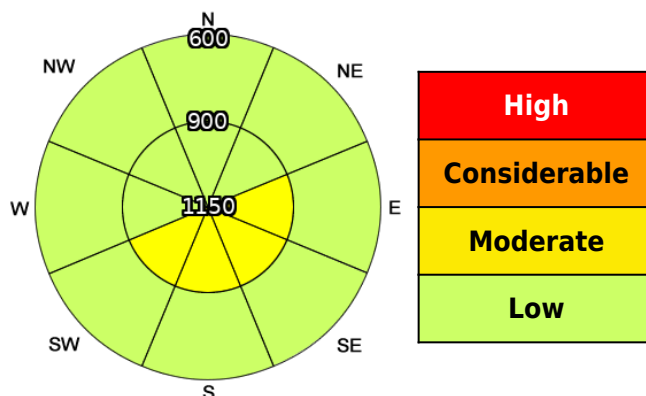
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Cold temperatures will maintain the slow rate of consolidation. Moderately bonded windslab will be encountered in wind sheltered locations on East through South to South-West aspects above 900 metres. Worst affected areas will include gully tops and steep corrie rims. Exposed terrain will be scoured and often firm. Many locations will present shallow snow over bare ground. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Another mainly dry day has been forecast with just a trace of snow expected during the late afternoon. Light increasing to moderate, generally North-Easterly winds. Very cold overnight, with the freezing level rising to around 400 metres during the afternoon.

Comments

Trail breaking required in less popular locations. Burn crossings are icy in the early mornings.
