

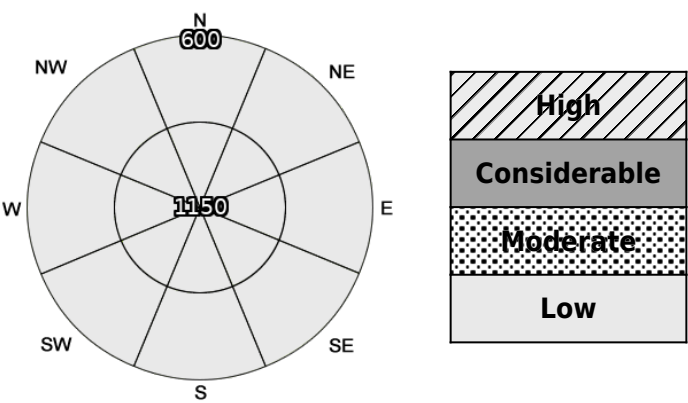

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 10/03/2023

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The older snowpack, which exists mainly in North and East facing corries above 900 metres, will remain well bonded, firm and stable in all locations. Redistribution will form isolated shallow windslab deposits on steep South-West and West aspects above 900 metres, however these are not expected to be extensive and will often overlie bare ground. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will remain very cold and mainly dry. Strong East-North-Easterly winds in the evening will become light and back to Westerly by dawn.

Comments

Older snowpack underneath the soft layer remains very firm and icy, often with steep runouts on to rocks below. Any slip is likely to have serious consequences.
