

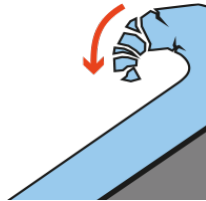

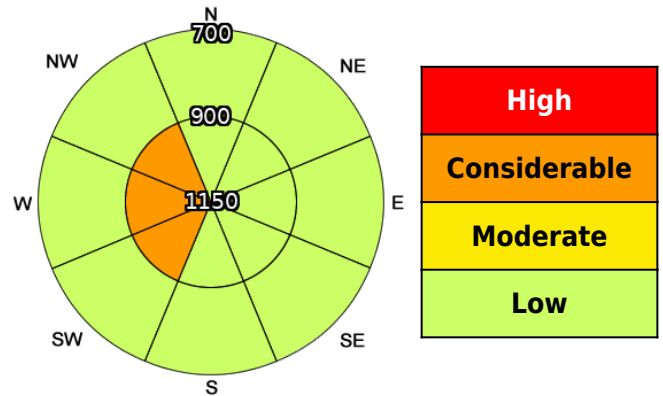
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

A return to cooler conditions by morning will start to firm up the existing snowpack improving general stability. New snow and a strong North-Easterly winds will form accumulations of unstable windslab in wind sheltered areas. Greatest accumulations will mainly be in summit gullies and on slopes with a South-West to North-Westerly aspect above 900 metres. Fragile cornices may exist above these areas. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Mild conditions with rain or sleet will continue for much of the night. A return to colder conditions by morning will give new snow to lower levels as the day progresses. Winds through the day will be strong generally North-Easterly. The freezing level by morning will be around 800 metres lowering to 200 metres by evening.

Comments

Old snow where exposed will become firm and icy in places, serious consequences will exist in the event of an uncontrolled slip or fall.
