





Wind Slab





Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

During the evening some wet snow instabilities will be present on steep North-West through North to East aspects above 900 metres. These will diminish as the freezing level drops. From midnight onwards and throughout the day unstable windslab will be deposited in wind sheltered areas, mainly on South to West aspects above 800 metres. South-East and North-West aspects will also be affected. Fragile cornices will build above these aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will initially be South-Westerly, then overnight will back and strengthen to strong to gale force East-North-Easterly and North-North-Easterly during the afternoon. The freezing level will initially be above the summits, then from midnight lower steadily to 200 metres by end of the afternoon. Snowfall from midnight onwards will fall to increasingly lower levels.
