

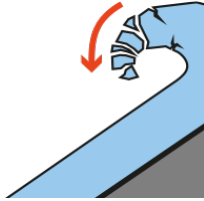

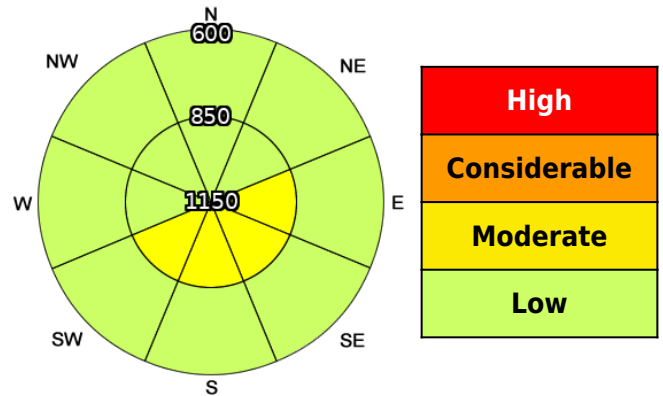
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Accumulations of moderately bonded windslab will be present, mostly on East through South to South-West aspects above 850 metres. Steep wind sheltered locations such as gully tops and corrie rims will be worst affected. Elsewhere, exposed terrain will remain very firm and icy. Isolated pockets of deeper snow will also be found at lower levels. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Remaining cold at all levels with isolated snow showers at times. Winds will be fresh in strength, North-West to North-North-West throughout.

Comments

Old snow refreezing becoming firm and icy. Greater amounts of windslab likely along our Northern boundary.
