





Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will be moist and generally stable in all locations. Isolated surface instabilities may be present, mainly on steep North-West through North-East to South-East aspects above 900 metres. The snowpack will thaw at all levels and any remaining superficial snow cover at lower elevations will become further depleted. Cornices will be weak and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Staying mild with the freezing level remaining above the summits. It will be mostly dry with a few localised rain showers possible during the afternoon. Southerly winds, initially very strong, decreasing steadily to become light by the end of the period.

Comments

Stabilising trend continuing in the mild temperatures.
