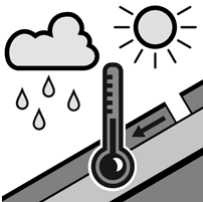


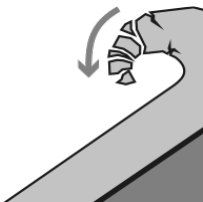

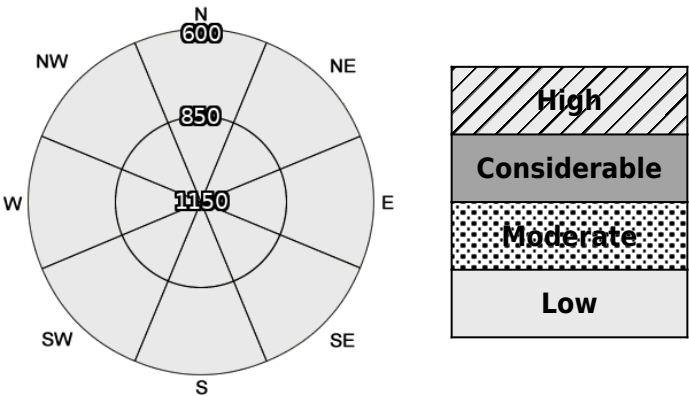

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New snow amounts are not expected to be significant, mainly a light dusting over the highest summits. The snowpack will continue to slowly thaw but remain generally well bonded and stable. Residual areas of wet snow instabilities may still exist on steeper North to East aspects with gully exits and steep coire rims mostly affect. Greatest snow amounts will be present on North to Easterly aspects above 850 metres. Any remaining cornices will soft and unstable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will be just above the summits. After a dry night light rain is expected at most levels during the day, there is a possibility for a dusting of sleet or wet snow over the very highest summits. Winds will be moderate to fresh and generally Southerly.

Comments

Drier conditions expected for Saturday night followed by colder and dry weather for most of Sunday.
