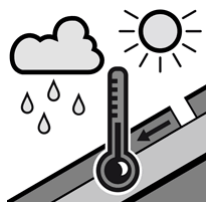


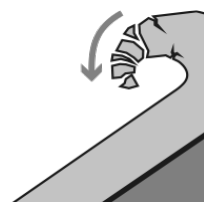

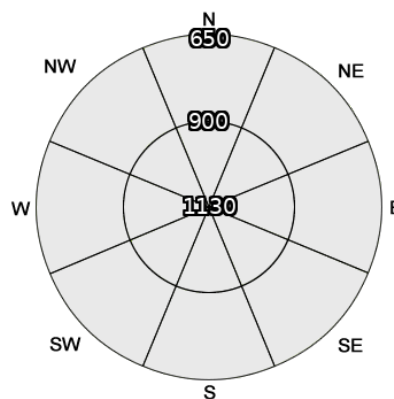

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected. The snowpack will remain generally stable throughout, moist and continue to thaw at all levels. Greatest snow accumulations will be on North-West through North to Easterly aspects above 800m, mostly around coire rims and in gullies. Small cornices will be weak and prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will remain above the summits. A mainly dry night then rain showers in the morning, merging into longer periods of rain in the afternoon. Light South-Easterly winds will steadily increase to fresh overnight, then back South-West late afternoon.

Comments

Threat from rockfall in thaw conditions. Expected to be dry and colder on Sunday, then wet and mild again on Monday.
