

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

During the evening some fresh windslab will be deposited in wind sheltered areas, mainly on North-West to North-East aspects above 1000 metres. Areas gaining depth are not expected to be extensive. These will thaw during the day, with possible minor surface wet snow instabilities. The old snowpack will be generally stable at all levels and on all aspects. Remaining cornices will be prone to collapse during the thaw. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will initially be light to moderate South-South-Westerly soon backing South-Easterly and remaining so for the rest of the period, strengthening during the afternoon. During the evening the freezing level will be around 900 metres and light snowfall is expected. From midnight the freezing level will rise above the summits and it will then be dry until the afternoon when rain is expected at all levels.
