

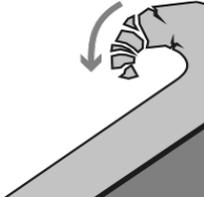


Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

From dawn onwards fresh unstable windslab will continue to be deposited in wind sheltered areas. Greatest accumulations will build on North to East aspects above 900 metres. The old snowpack will be generally stable and during the day its surface will refreeze in the colder conditions. New fragile cornices will build during the day above North to East aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be moderate to strong generally South-South-Easterly overnight and strong South-Westerly from just before dawn onwards through the day. Overnight rain at all levels will turn to snow just before dawn, above around 800 metres as the freezing level lowers from above the summits to around 800 metres.
