

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will continue to consolidate and the snow surface will begin to refreeze as temperatures fall. Snowpack stability will be good in most locations with isolated instabilities that remain on steep North-West through North to East aspects above 1250 metres consolidating throughout the period. New snow fall amounts are not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

A few light showers before dawn will fall as snow above 700 metres and clear to give a mainly dry day. Moderate North-Easterly winds will veer Easterly during the afternoon. The freezing level will be around 1100 metres at the start of the night and fall to be around 700 metres during the day.
