



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 30/03/2023

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The patchy snow will continue to slowly thaw but will remain well bonded and stable throughout. Largest areas of snow will be encountered above 900 metres, especially on the highest mountains with summits above 1100 metres. Any remaining cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Remaining mild with the freezing level above the summits. Light rain or drizzle through the evening followed by a dry night and morning. Very light rain showers expected during the afternoon. Moderate South-Westerly, backing Southerly winds. Freezing level over the summits.

Comments

Remaining unsettled right through to the weekend.
