

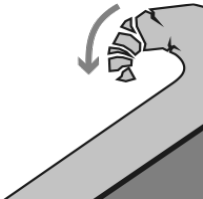

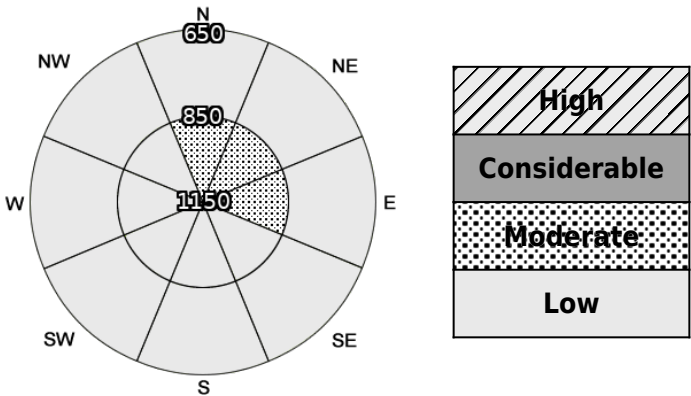
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised accumulations of shallow windslab will develop mainly on Northerly to Easterly aspects above 850 metres. Greatest instabilities will be where deep accumulations form on the older existing, steep snowpack. Wind sheltered locations, gully tops and steep coire headwalls will be particularly affected. Cornices will also start to develop above these aspects. Elsewhere the old snowpack will remain well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will lower to around 800 metres rising slightly by late afternoon. Snow showers falling mainly above 700 metres, rain below this elevation. Winds will be fresh to strong and mostly West-South-Westerly.
