




Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh unstable windslab will be deposited in wind sheltered areas, mainly on North through East to South-East aspects above 900 metres. Accumulations gaining depth will generally be localised. Fragile cornices will build above these aspects. The old snowpack will be generally stable and its surface will refreeze in the colder conditions. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be moderate to strong, Westerly during the evening then West-South-Westerly through the morning and backing Southerly during the afternoon. The freezing level will generally be around 800 metres. Snow showers above 700 metres are expected throughout the period.

Comments

Main accumulations of old snow lie on North to East aspects above 850m, and in favoured snow-holding areas on plateaux.
