

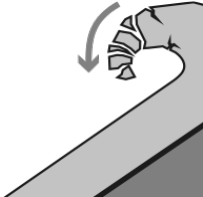

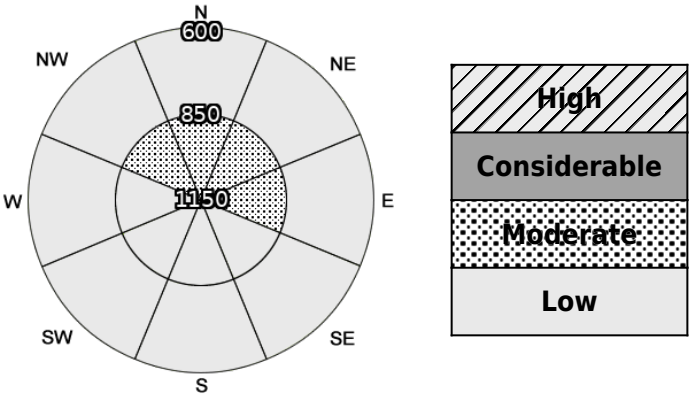

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

New accumulations of unstable windslab will develop mostly on North-West through North to Easterly aspects mainly above 850 metres. Wind sheltered locations, gully tops and steep coire headwalls will be particularly affected. Greatest instabilities will be where deep accumulations form on the older existing snowpack. Fragile cornices will also start to develop above these aspects. Elsewhere the snowpack will remain well bonded. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will lower to around 500 metres. Overnight, persistent snow showers continuing through most of the day. Winds will be East-South-Easterly at first and very strong, becoming South-South-Westerly then Southerly and easing slightly towards the afternoon.

Comments

New snow amounts are forecast to be significant this evening and on Wednesday. Scattered snow showers on Thursday and Friday with freezing level around 900 metres.
