

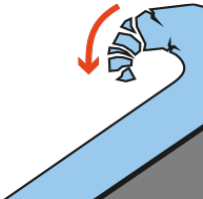

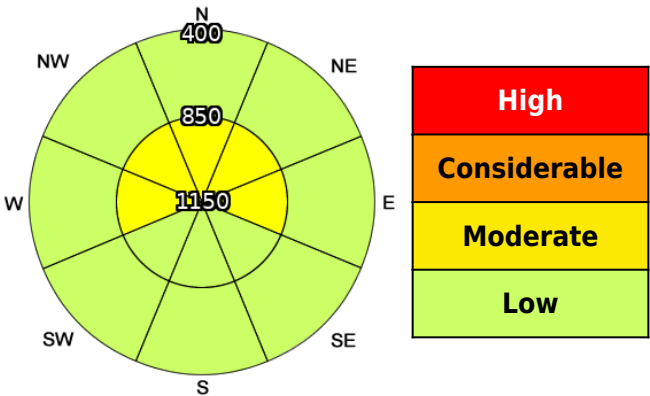
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will exist in wind sheltered locations. Greatest accumulations will be in sheltered summit gullies and on steeper scarp slopes mainly above 850 metres with a West through North to Easterly aspect. Greatest instabilities will be where deep accumulations form on the older existing snowpack. Fragile cornices above these aspects will be prone to collapse. Where exposed, the older snowpack will be firm and icy in places. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

New snow will affect the area overnight and later on Thursday, amounts are not expected to be great. Winds will be fresh generally Easterly overnight decreasing to moderate West-South-West through the day. The freezing level will be around 900-1000 metres.

Comments

A return to full on Winter conditions. The older existing snow pack will generally be stable. New snow amounts are not expected to be great.
