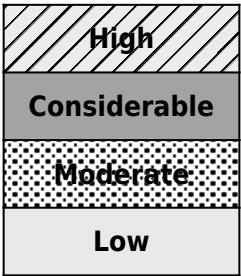
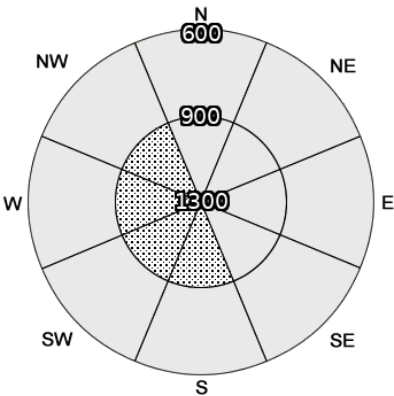

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab, deep in places, gradually becoming more extensive on mostly South-Westerly through West to North-Westerly aspects. This overlies a weak snowpack structure with steep places such as gully tops, coire rims, crag aprons and wind sheltered areas at lower elevations most affected. Developing unstable cornices on same aspects will threaten slopes below. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate



Forecast Weather Influences

Winds will be light to moderate strength North-East to Easterly. A mostly dry and bright day is expected with a freezing level around 400m. Another cold day on the tops with summit temperatures around -7 deg C.

Comments

Poor visibility limited observations. Windslab most limited in extent but gradually developing. Alright cold day expected.
