




Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Isolated accumulations of windslab will be deposited on very steep, wind sheltered North-West through North to South-East aspects above 1100 metres. Coire rims and gully tops will only be affected where moderately bonded accumulations overlie the existing snowpack or achieve depth. Outwith these areas a light dusting of snow will cover bare ground. Cornices will develop around coire rims. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

After a dry night, precipitation is expected to fall as snow above 700 metres for the duration of the day. The freezing level will fall in the first part of the night, to be around 800 metres for most of the day. Winds will generally be from the West, gale force increasing to storm force by dawn.

Comments

Snow amounts are expected to be small. But there is uncertainty, greater volumes are possible if showers merge.
