

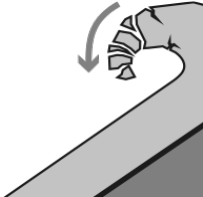

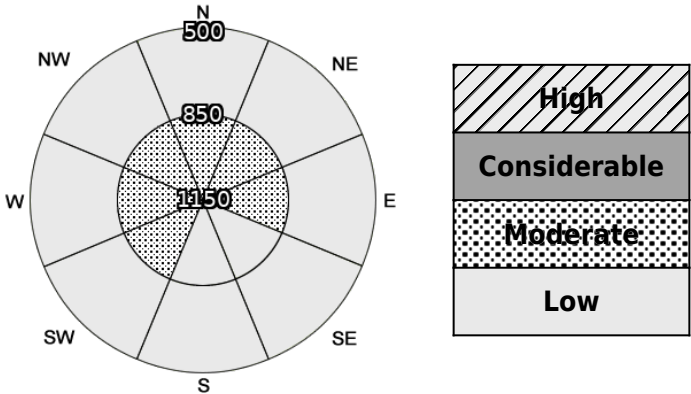

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised areas of, generally shallow, fresh unstable windslab will develop on South-West through West to North aspects above 850 metres. Recent windslab deposits on North-East and East aspects will also persist. Areas most affected will be steep slopes, gullies and coire rims. Older moderately bond windslab will also be present in the above areas. Fragile cornices above all these aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Showers throughout the day will initially fall as snow above 500 metres turning to rain below around 1150 metres in the afternoon. Gale force Easterly winds overnight will decrease throughout the day to become fresh and veer South-Easterly. The freezing level will rise from 700 metres to around the highest summits during the afternoon.
