
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Existing instabilities will remain above 900 metres mainly on West through North to North-East aspects, with steep wind sheltered locations such as coire rims and gully tops most affected. Some shallow deposits of fresh windslab will develop in the same locations. Elsewhere the snowpack will continue to consolidate and stabilise. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

A mainly dry night, then occasional showers during the day, falling as snow above around 1000 metres. Strong South-South-Easterly winds throughout. The freezing level will fluctuate around the summits.

Comments

Freezing level to hover around summit level. Expect snow loss at lower elevations.
