

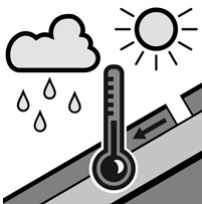

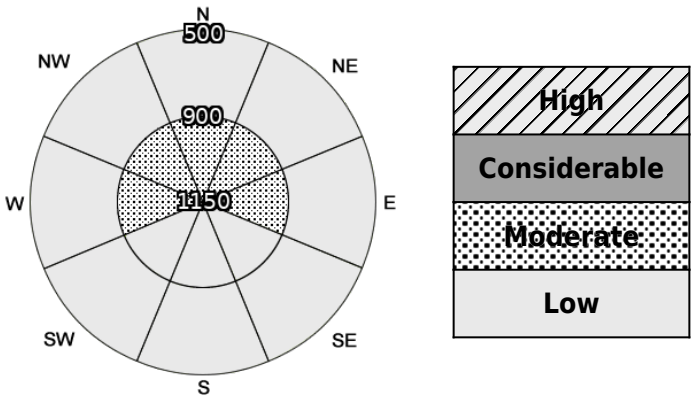
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Wet snow instabilities will develop where deeper accumulations are present on steep slopes. Areas most affected will be West through North to East aspect above 900 metres. Gullies, coire back walls and crag aprons will be most affected. Isolated accumulations of fresh windslab possible on steep North-West and North aspects above 1050 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Showers throughout the period will fall as rain at most levels, only turning to snow above around 1050 metres. Fresh South-South-Easterly winds. The freezing level will be around 1150 metres.

Comments

Some uncertainty in precipitation amounts with up to 20mm rain possible at most levels.
