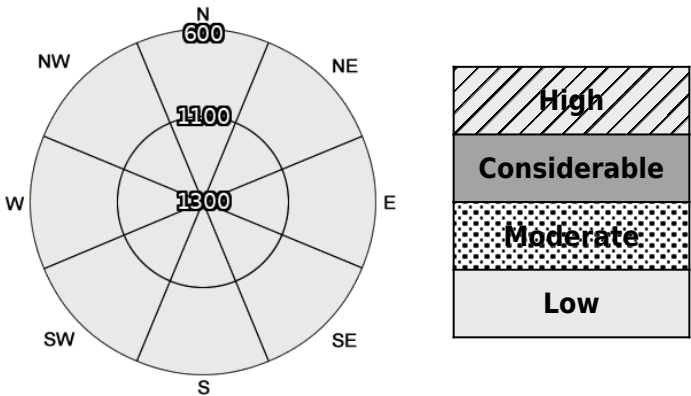
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will continue to slowly stabilise. Isolated surface instabilities will remain in very steep wind sheltered locations above 1100 metres where a friable crust overlies soft snow. Well bonded and mostly stable windslab will remain on North-West to North-East aspects above 1000 metres, in areas such as coire rims and headwalls. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

A dry day is expected. Winds will be fresh, West-South-West overnight veering through West to become West-North-West by the end of the day. The freezing level will be around 800 metres.

Comments

Icy footpaths and a firm snow surface in some locations will result in consequential mountain travel.
