



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Monday 29/01/2024

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing snowpack will refreeze in the cooler conditions and stability will be good. Isolated and shallow windslab accumulations, mainly on North-East and East aspects above 1000 metres are not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Very strong West-South-Westerly winds initially, ease overnight and become light and variable during the day. Precipitation in the evening falling as snow on the higher summits followed by a dry day. The freezing level will drop from above the summits to around 600 metres.

Comments

The older snowpack will become firm as the temperature drops. Snow cover has become patchy with best coverage on North to East aspects above 900 metres.
