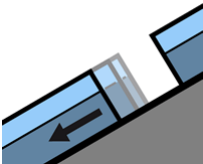

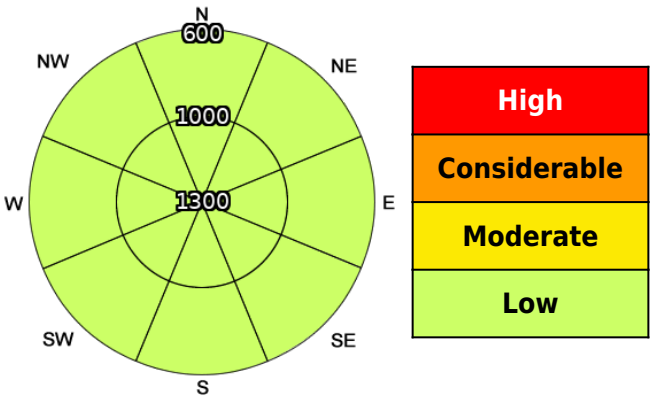
Avalanche Problems



Gliding Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will remain firm, icy, and be generally stable with the greatest cover found on North-West through North to East aspects above 900 metres. Instabilities will remain on Easterly aspects above 850 metres and in steep locations subject to solar radiation. Out-with these areas, the snow cover will be patchy and the ground scoured. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

A generally dry day is expected. Winds will be light westerlies overnight. During the day the winds will be generally West-South-Westerly increasing from fresh to very strong by the end of the period. The freezing level will be 700 metres overnight, rising slightly to 900 metres by the end of the day.

Comments

A stable airmass will result in a frozen and icy snow surface in most locations. A slide or fall may be consequential.
