

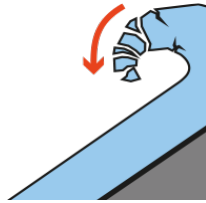

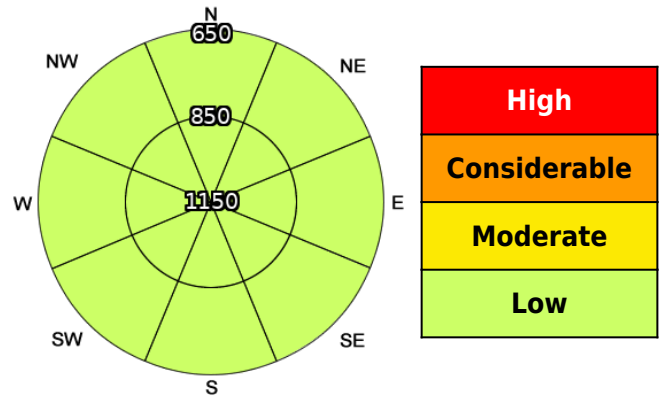

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Overnight, the snowpack will start to soften and become moist at all levels due to a rapid rise in freezing levels and rain saturating the snowpack. Localised wet snow instabilities will develop through this period mainly on North through East to South-East aspects above 850m. Steep wind sheltered locations, gully tops and coire rims will be most affected. Cornices above these aspects will be prone to collapse. Elsewhere the snowpack will generally be stable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Freezing levels rapidly rising to around 3000m during this evening then dropping to around 1600m by late afternoon. Rain or drizzle will generally be continuous through this period. Winds will be strong West-South-Westerly with gales or severe gales over the higher summits with the possibly of storm force gusts.

Comments

Another stormy, mild day is forecast with rain at all levels.
