
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing snowpack will begin to refreeze and be well bonded and stable throughout. Localised accumulations of fresh unstable windslab will develop very gradually through the day mostly on steep North-East and East aspects, above 950 metres. Accumulations will generally be shallow and affect wind sheltered areas such as gullies and coire rims. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Becoming colder as the freezing level falls from above the summits to around 800 metres during the night. Showers from very early morning will be snow above 800 metres during daylight hours. Very strong West-South-Westerly winds.

Comments

Some uncertainty in snowfall amounts due to showery nature of precipitation.
