

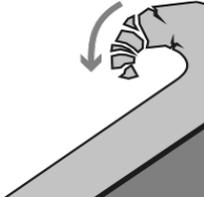


Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised areas of fresh unstable windslab will continue to develop mainly on North-East and East aspects above 1050 metres. Isolated deposits also possible on North and South-East aspects. Areas most affected will be steep wind sheltered areas such as gully tops and coire rims. Elsewhere the older snowpack will remain well bonded and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Showers throughout the period will initially fall as snow above 900 metres turning to rain below 1050 metres as the freezing level rises to 1100 metres during the afternoon. Gale force West-South-Westerly winds gradually decreasing and veering to Westerly during the afternoon.
