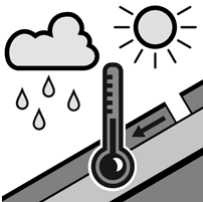


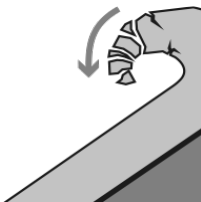

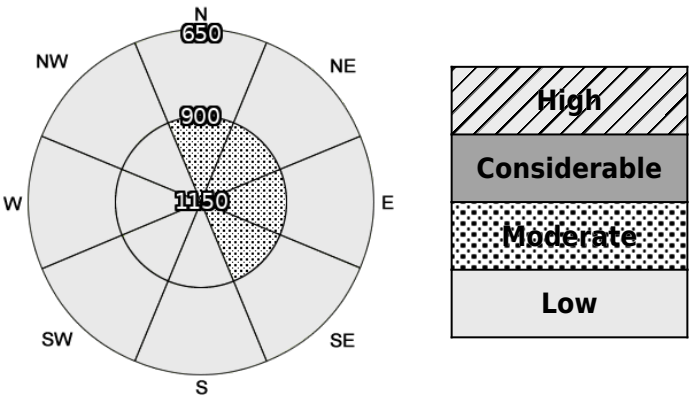
Wet Snow

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing areas of windslab will become wet and unstable as the freezing level rises and heavy rain affects the snowpack. Wet snow instabilities are expected on wind-sheltered North through East to South-East aspects above 900 metres with gully tops and coire rims particularly affected. Cornices will be prone to collapse affecting slopes below. Windward aspects will hold little snow, and stability will be much better on these aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will rise to well above the summits with large amounts of persistent rain falling at all levels. West-South-Westerly winds will remain strong to gale force.

Comments

Large amounts of rain are forecast for the area tomorrow with freezing levels around 1800 metres.
