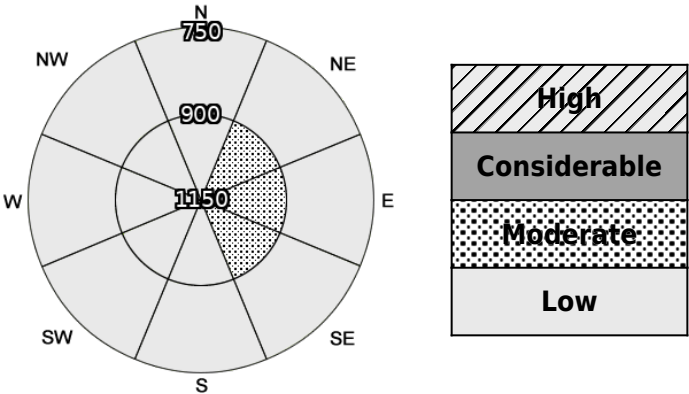
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snowpack will be firm and icy with good general stability. Areas of windslab will form in wind sheltered locations such as gully exits and around the tops of North through East to South-East scarp slopes. These areas are not expected to be deep or extensive. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will remain cold with light snow showers overnight and on Wednesday. The freezing level will be around 300 metres. Winds will be fresh occasionally strong generally Westerly.

Comments

Firm and icy snowpack with potentially serious outcomes in the event of a slip or fall. With light snow expected accumulations of windslab are not expected to be deep or extensive but bonding to underlying refrozen snow will be poor.
