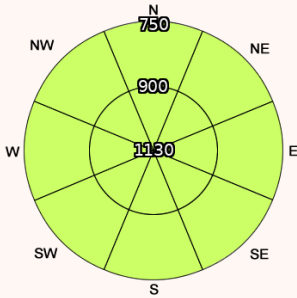


Avalanche Hazard Forecast - FOR PERIOD 18:00HRS Tue 06/02/2024 TO 18:00HRS Wed 07/02/2024



Hazard Level	Avalanche Probability
Very High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. Numerous very large, often extremely large natural avalanches can be expected.
High	Natural and human triggered avalanches will occur. In some cases, numerous large, often very large sized natural avalanches can be expected.
Considerable	Natural and human triggered avalanches possible, in some cases large, in isolated cases very large sized natural avalanches are possible.
Moderate	Very large sized natural avalanches are unlikely. Human triggering possible in indicated steep places.
Low	Only small and medium sized natural avalanches are possible. Human triggering possible in steep, extreme terrain.

Forecast Weather Influences

A cold North-Westerly airstream will bring light snow showers overnight. Winds will be moderate to fresh from the North-West, backing Westerly during the day. Freezing level will be around 400 meters.

Forecast Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

The existing snowpack will be frozen and stable. Some fresh deposits of isolated windslab will form on North-East through East to South-East aspects above 900 meters in wind sheltered locations. Accumulations are not expected to be significant and will be avoidable. The avalanche hazard will be Low

Observed Avalanche Hazard - Tue 06/02/2024

Observed Weather Influences

Squally snow showers interspersed with blue skies. Gale force winds from the West-North-West. Freezing level was around 700 meters.

Observed Snow Stability and Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack has refrozen and become well bonded, firm and icy. The greatest cover remains on North through East to South-East aspects above 900 meters. Small isolated areas of soft new snow can be found in wind-sheltered areas. The avalanche hazard is Low

Mountain Conditions

Observed Mountain Travel Conditions

Very hard snow ice on remaining snow patches. Cloudy on the tops with some bright spells. Winds approx 40 - 50 mph making progress very difficult and strenuous.

Comments

Low snow amounts are forecast overnight on showery North-West airstream, be prepared to recalibrate your on the ground assessment If more snow arrives. Firm snow-ice creating exposed runouts.
