




Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Unstable windslab will remain on North-West through North to South-East aspects above 900 metres. Accumulations will be localised due to cross loading, but weak where they gain depth and overlie the older firm snowpack. Areas most affected will be gullies and steep wind sheltered terrain. Later some redistribution of existing snow will create further accumulations on the same aspects. Fresh and unstable cornices will continue to develop. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Occasional snow showers are expected during the day above 800 metres. Winds will be light South-South-Easterly overnight, veering to the South-West and becoming strong by the end of the period. The freezing level will be around 1100 metres overnight, lowering to around 900 metres by the end of the day.

Comments

Firm snow will remain a potential hazard with poor runouts.
