





Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Instabilities will persist in poorly bonded windslab accumulations on steep North to East aspects, mostly above 850 metres, with localised areas remaining at lower elevations. Fragile cornices will exist above these aspects. Through the day redistribution will cause localised areas of unstable windslab to also develop in wind sheltered locations on West and North-West aspects, mostly above 950 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

After a dry night and morning, light showers in the afternoon will initially be summit snow turning to rain at all levels. Light East-South-Easterly winds at dawn will increase to strong by the end of the afternoon. The freezing level will be around 800 metres overnight, rising above all summits during the day.
