

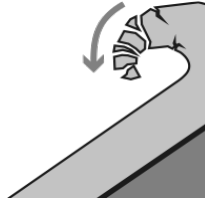

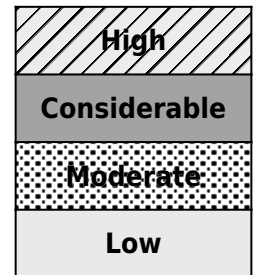
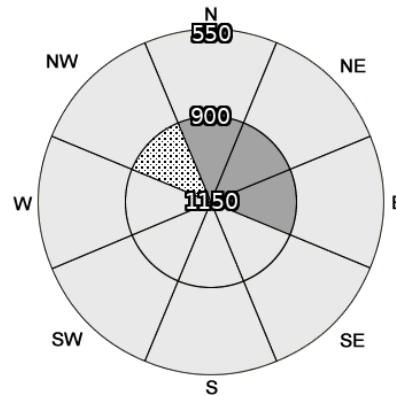

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

As the freezing level rises and rain affects the snowpack the existing areas of windslab will initially start to consolidate. Then wet snow instabilities are expected to develop mainly on steep wind sheltered North to East aspects above 900 metres with gully tops and coire rims particularly affected. Other steep aspects may also be affected. Cornices will be prone to collapse, possibly affecting slopes below. The avalanche hazard will be Considerable.



Forecast Weather Influences

A gradual thaw is expected as the freezing level rises to well above the highest summits. Precipitation will fall as rain at all levels, accompanied by fresh to strong South-Easterly winds which will ease and veer to become Southerly.

Comments

Milder conditions expected for tomorrow with developing instabilities.
