

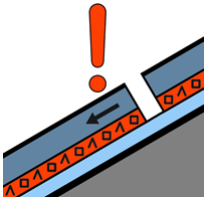

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 15/02/2024

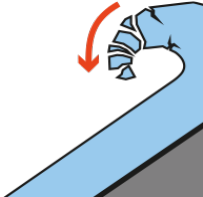
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab



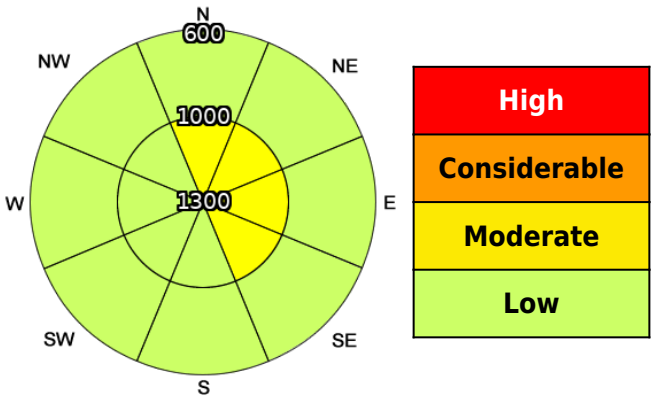
Persistent Weak Layers

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Weaknesses within the snow pack will persist initially on North through East to South-East aspects above 1000 metres. Areas most affected will be steep convex wind sheltered locations such as coire rims, gully tops and ridge flanks. Cornices will be prone to collapse. Later, the snowpack will slowly start to consolidate. The existing old snowpack will be stable and well bonded throughout. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light South-South-Easterly winds will veer to the South-South-West during the forecast period; increasing to strong overnight before easing to fresh for daylight hours. Overnight rain, with snow confined to the highest summits, will clear to leave a dry day. The freezing level will slowly rise to 2000 metres.

Comments

After some overnight drizzle, the snowpack will slowly start to consolidate throughout the day.
