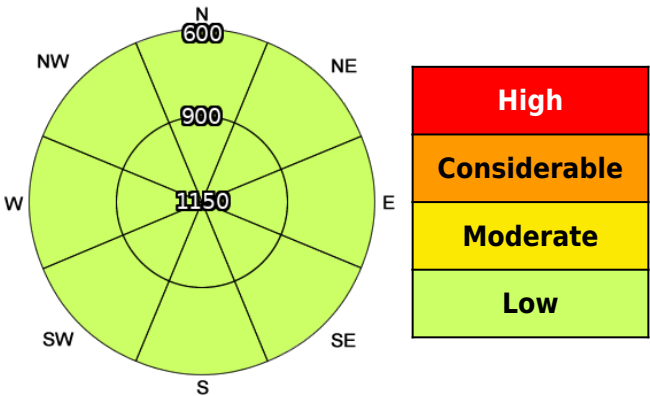

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will continue to slowly thaw but should remain generally well bonded. Isolated wet snow instabilities may exist on steeper slopes, mainly on North to East aspects above 950 metres. Areas most affected will be around steep gully tops and coire rims. At lower levels the spring snowpack will continue to thaw and diminish. Any remaining cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will continue to remain above the summits through the period. A dry morning with the possibility of light showers in the afternoon these maybe sleet on the highest summits. The light South-Easterly winds will strengthen becoming strong South-South-Easterly.

Comments

Remaining mild, a weak ridge of high pressure will keep winds generally light and conditions dry.
