
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Isolated areas of unstable windslab will be present on mainly North to East aspects above 900 metres. Steep, wind sheltered locations such as gully tops and corrie rims where a firm old snow base exists are the most likely locations where windslab will be encountered. Elsewhere, soft snow will lie on bare ground. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

No precipitation has been forecast. Light to moderate North-Easterly winds. 550 metre freezing level rising to around 800 metres by mid-afternoon.

Comments

Windslab poorly bonded where present. Old snow firm and icy. Some paths very icy.
