

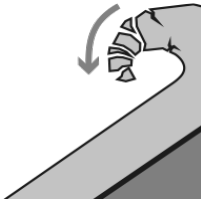

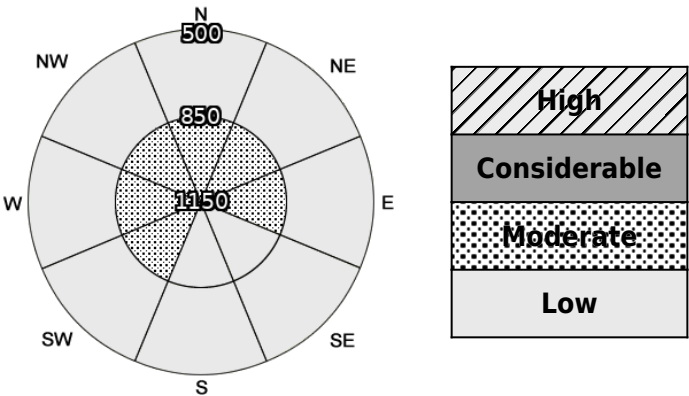

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised instabilities in recent windslab deposits will continue to persist. Steep summit gullies and coire rims on North to East aspects mainly above 850 metres will be particularly affected. Fragile cornices will be present above these aspects. Some further new windslab development and snow redistribution onto South-West to North-West aspects can be expected, however any new deposits are not expected to reach significant depth or to be extensive. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

The freezing level will be around 600 metres rising slightly towards the end of the period. Some snow showers during the early hours of the morning then a predominately dry day is expected. Winds will be fresh to strong, initially Easterly veering, becoming South-South-Easterly.

Comments

Remaining cool, a few light snow showers possible on Sunday night otherwise dry, similar for Monday. Winds gradually strengthening from S to SE, freezing levels around 500m.
