

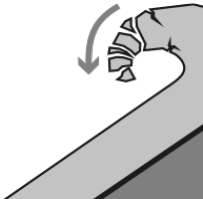

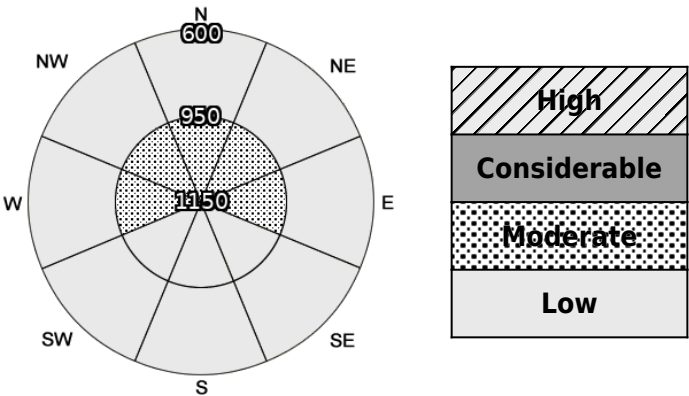
Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Little change is expected to the snowpack above 950 metres. Isolated pockets of poorly bonded shallow windslab will still remain, mainly on West through North to East aspects above 950 metres. These deposits are quite localised and generally not extensive with summit gully scarp slopes, gully exits and steep coire head walls mainly affected. Fragile cornices overhang similar aspects. At lower elevations snow cover will slowly dissipate. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Dry conditions will continue to affect the area with freezing level around 1000 metres. Fresh winds will remain generally South-Easterly, strong at times.

Comments

The snowpack is generally fairly well bonded in most places, see the detailed report for the locations of instabilities. Also Westerly aspects are affected due to snow redistribution and cross loading.
