


Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will be generally well bonded, icy and stable. Some isolated areas of wind slab will be present in wind sheltered locations on mainly West through North to North-East aspects above 1000 metres. Gully tops and scarp slopes will be most affected. These accumulations are not expected to be significant and will be mostly avoidable. Firm cornices will overhang many of the same aspects. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Fresh to strong East-South-East winds will decrease to moderate and veer to become South-East during the afternoon. Trace amounts of snow are expected later in the day. Summit temperatures will be around -3 degrees C.

Comments

Slightly less windy day in prospect with many slopes remaining firm and icy.
