



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 14/03/2024

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Generally the snowpack will be consolidated and stable throughout. Greatest amounts will be on North to Easterly aspects above 800 metres, with most snow cover in the inland ranges, especially around coire rims and headwalls. A new dusting of snow will lie on North to Easterly aspects above 900 metres or so, but accumulations are not expected to be significant. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Overnight severe gale to storm force South-Westerly winds will ease in strength, backing to light Easterly by morning. Some precipitation will fall as sleet and snow on the summits, lying mostly above 950 metres.

Comments

Fluctuating temperatures with freezing level hovering above and below summits. Remaining snow firm with serious consequences for any slips or trips!
