
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Localised and generally shallow areas of unstable windslab will develop through the period with greatest accumulations on South to West aspects above 1000 metres. Features such as gullies, corrie rims and ridge flanks will be most affected. The older snowpack will refreeze and become firm and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light Easterly winds initially, will back to Northerly and become fresh during the day. Showers will fall as snow above 1200 metres in the evening with the snow/rain boundary then gradually dropping to 700 metres. The freezing level will drop from 1300 metres to around 800 metres .

Comments

After snow on Friday it's looking like a fairly dry weekend with temperatures rising on Sunday.
