

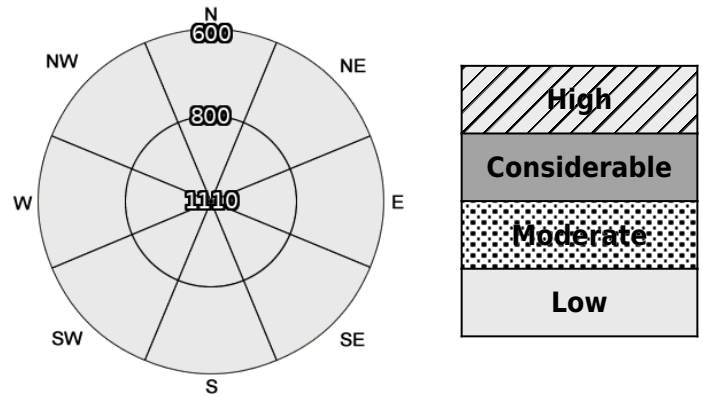

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Saturday 16/03/2024

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The recent shallow covering of snow above 650 metres, mostly lying on bare ground, will thaw at lower levels through the day. Isolated deeper deposits of snow are likely in sheltered South to South-West aspects above 800 metres, but will not be significant. The old snow will remain firm and well bonded, largely found on high North to East aspects on the more inland mountains. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Showers will peter out early evening to give a largely dry day, although a little summit snow is possible late afternoon on the coastal hills. Fresh Northerly winds will become light overnight, freshening again and veering South-East through the day. Colder overnight, with the freezing level rising from around 600 metres to near summit levels by day.

Comments

A ridge of high pressure tomorrow will give a sunnier break before the next unsettled period arrives Saturday night. Becoming milder again.
