



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 20/03/2024

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The old snow will be well bonded and stable with a crust developing above 1000 metres. Superficial new snow accumulations may form on South to West aspects above 850 metres but they will be of no consequence. Deepest accumulations will be found in wind sheltered locations on North to East aspects above 900 metres. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

A dry night, followed by some very light snowfall above 850 metres during the morning. Moderate East, backing North-North-East winds during the snowfall period. Freezing level lowering briefly to 850 metres during the morning, rising to 1050 metres by mid-afternoon.

Comments

Fluctuating freezing levels for the rest of the week. Weather remaining unsettled. Looking colder for Friday.
