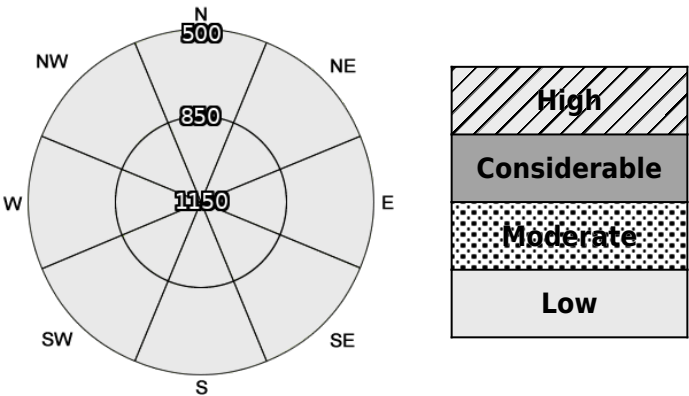
Avalanche Problems



Wind Slab

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Fresh accumulations of windslab will begin to form in wind sheltered locations on North through East to South-East aspects above 850 metres. These accumulations are expected to be isolated, shallow and easily avoidable, falling onto the existing wet snowpack or bare ground. The older snowpack will begin to refreeze. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Turning wintry overnight with snow showers falling to lower levels as the temperature drops. Snow showers will continue for the remainder of the day with freezing levels around 500 metres. Winds will remain gale to storm force from the West.

Comments

Snow showers on Saturday above 600 metres with a North-Westerly airflow.
