



##### Avalanche Problems




Wind Slab

##### Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

Wind redistribution of existing deposits combined with new snowfall will form wind slab in wind sheltered locations on mainly South through West to North-West aspects above 900 metres. Where accumulations achieve depth over firmer snow-ice they will be unstable. Small, fragile wind features will form on these aspects. Elsewhere there will be no snow, thin cover or firm old snow. The avalanche hazard will be Moderate.



##### Forecast Weather Influences

Light snowfall to glen level just before day break. During the day the light precipitation will continue, falling as snow only at increasingly higher altitudes, reaching 900 metres by late afternoon. Near gale force North-Easterly winds overnight, easing to strong East-North-Easterlies by morning, then moderate South-Easterly by the end of the period.

##### Comments

Some uncertainty over new snowfall amounts due to showery nature of the precipitation and high wind speeds.
