



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Thursday 28/03/2024

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The older snowpack will be well bonded, firm and stable in all locations. A thin layer of fresh, stable snow will exist above around 600 metres, with slightly deeper deposits present on Westerly aspects. These deposits will thaw and consolidate as the temperature rises through the day. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

A mainly dry day with some showers developing at the end of the afternoon, these will be rain at most levels as the freezing level rises from 600m to around the highest summits. Fresh, mainly Easterly, winds increasing in strength through the day.

Comments

The older snowpack will remain firm and icy with many steeper slopes having serious runouts onto rocks below.
