

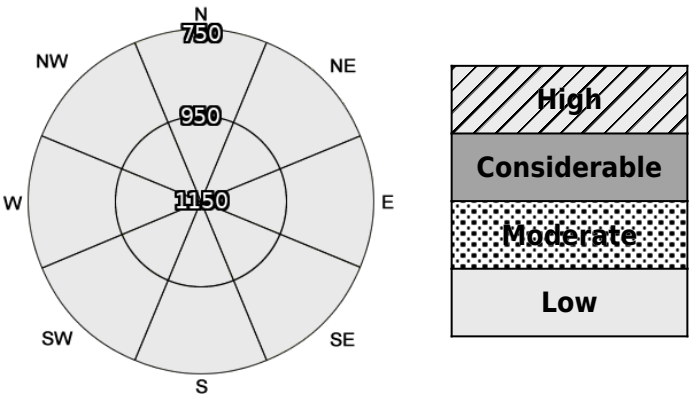

Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Friday 29/03/2024

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The recent, small deposits of windslab, found on South-West through West to North aspects above 950 metres, will consolidate and gain stability. There is the possibility of a small dusting of fresh snow on the highest summits, on North-East aspects during Friday afternoon, but these will be minimal. The older snowpack, generally found above 900 metres on steep North to East aspects will be firm and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

It will be largely dry overnight and into Friday morning. There will be occasional light showers in the afternoon, with a small amount of sleet / snow only on the very highest summits. Freezing level will remain around 950 metres throughout the period, rising slightly in the afternoon. Strong-Easterly winds overnight will veer to become light South-Westerly by morning and slowly increase to moderate.

Comments

Milder on the tops today than expected. Looking ahead, there may be a few showers of snow, but only on the highest tops on Saturday. Milder on Sunday, with freezing level above the Glencoe summits. Winds should remain light.
