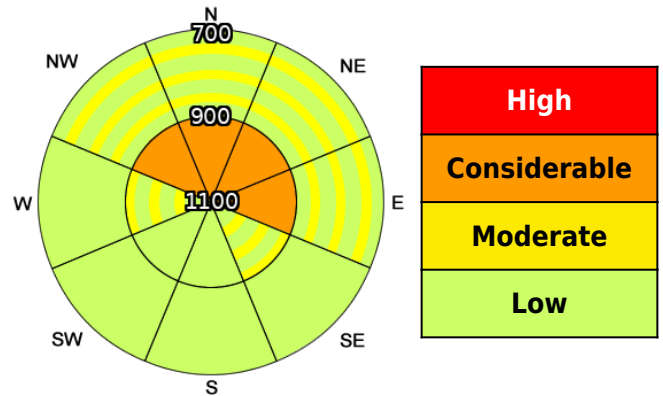

**Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard**

Overnight and into Saturday morning small amounts of fresh unstable windslab will develop on North-West to North-East aspects above 950 metres. These amounts are not expected to gain significant depth, and will affect wind sheltered locations such as gully tops, coire rims and steep scarp slopes above this altitude. Elsewhere the snowpack, will be firm and stable. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



**Forecast Weather Influences**

Overnight and into Saturday morning, there will be occasional showers, these being of snow above 900 metres. Freezing level will remain around 950 metres throughout the period. Winds will be mainly moderate to fresh Southerlies on the summits.

**Comments**

Snow amounts overnight and into the morning are not forecast to be significant, but there is some small uncertainty regards actual amounts in the showers. If greater amounts do fall, the deposits of fresh windslab may gain more depth than expected.
