



Avalanche Hazard Forecast for Wednesday 03/04/2024

Avalanche Problems

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The existing limited snow cover will be well consolidated and stable in all locations, refreezing at all levels overnight. There will be the lightest dusting of new snow above 500 metres, predominantly on the inland mountains, with more obvious accumulations likely on Western aspects where it will lie on bare ground. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Light precipitation will continue overnight, mainly in the eastern inland ranges and wintry above 500m. Largely dry and cloudy during the day. The strong to gale force Easterly airflow will persist throughout the period and the freezing level will gradually lower to around 400 metres by the end of the afternoon.

Comments

The very strong Easterly airflow combined with summit air temperatures as low as -4C tomorrow will produce a severe windchill. Likely to be less precipitation and cloud on the coastal hills tomorrow.
