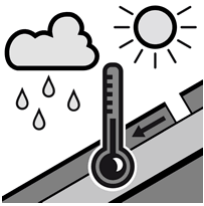


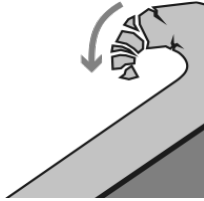

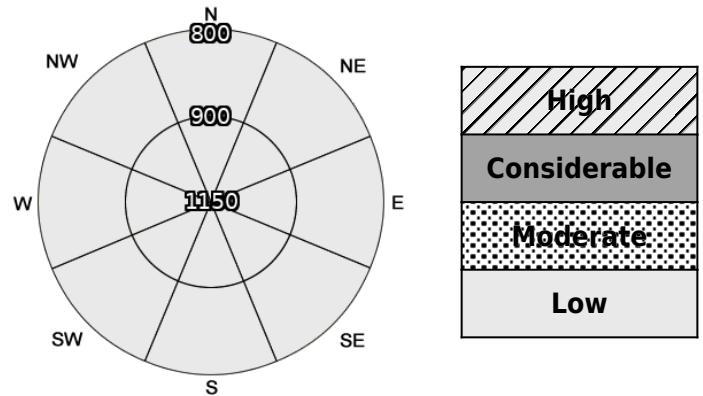

Forecast Snow Stability & Avalanche Hazard

The snowpack will further reduce in the mild and wet conditions. Stability will remain generally good on all but the steepest slopes where some surface wet snow instabilities may exist. Areas mostly affected will be on North to Easterly aspects above 900 metres, particularly gully exits and steep coire headwalls. Any remaining cornices will be prone to collapse. The avalanche hazard will be Low.



Forecast Weather Influences

Mild conditions with freezing levels generally well above the summits. South-Westerly gales will bring heavy rain during Wednesday evening and overnight. Rain eases early morning, then a dry bright day but strong to gale force West to South-Westerly winds persisting.

Comments

Remaining mild for next couple of days, colder conditions possibly arriving Saturday evening.
